Hope you've had a lovely summer. Have a look at what we have planned for the Autumn Term

English

This term we will start the term with the story 'The colour monster goes to school', which will allow for us to consider our own feelings and emotions.

We will be looking at simple sentence work, finger spaces and segmenting and blending to spell.

We will then move onto a story called 'The shopping basket', where we will be writing lists, food labels and captions.

We will finish the half term with a Halloween story called 'Spooky Rumpus', considering using a capital letter for the pronoun 'I'.

Maths

We use White Rose for the teaching of Maths:
Place Value

Sorting objects, counting objects, representing objects, recognising numbers as words, count on from any number, count one more, counting backwards, counting one less, comparing groups, fewer, more, the same, less than, greater than and equal to, comparing numbers, ordering objects and numbers, looking at number lines.



Adding and Subtracting:

Introducing part and whole, part-whole model, writing number sentences, fact families, number bonds within 10, addition, finding a part, subtraction, subtraction on a number line.

Science

This term we will be covering the topic of 'Animals including humans'.

We will be identifying animal offspring, looking at life cycles of humans and animals, exploring growing up, how we survive and how exercise and healthy living help us to lead longer lives.



Physical Education

CM Coaching will lead one PE Lesson:

Lesson 1 will be learning the basics of the invasion game - Football.
Lesson 2 will be focussing on fitness levels through circuit training.

We will also continue with our weekly swimming lesson

We will look at 'I am being more active' through our PACs Award.

Personal Development/POL-ED

The PSHE unit,
