English

This term we are looking at
'Stone Age Boy' to stimulate writing ideas and
develop the construction of sentences.



Step back 15,000 years as a modern boy enters a Stone Age village and learns a few prehistoric tricks of the trade.

Writing Outcomes:

Word families, Prepositions
Innovate the story using descriptive language, character interactions, setting details which encourage creativity and engagement.

Maths

We use White Rose for the teaching of Maths:

Place Value:

Represent, ordering, comparing and partition numbers up to 10,000.
Finding 1, 10, 100 and 1000 more or less from a given number.
Rounding to nearest, 10, 100 or 1000
Roman Numerals



Adding and Subtracting:

Add and subtract 1s, 10s, 100s and 1000s.
Add and subtract two 4-digit numbers, with no exchange,
one exchange and more than one exchange.
Estimate answers
Checking Strategies

Science

This term we will be covering the topic of
'Animals including humans'

They will explore the different organs of the digestive system in humans and the functions of teeth in both humans and animals. Children will learn about the different types of teeth and the importance of good dental hygiene.

They will investigate tooth decay using an egg as a model tooth. Children will learn about herbivores, carnivores and omnivores in the context of teeth, digestion and food chains.



Physical Education

CM Coaching will lead one PE Lesson:
They will be learning the basics of the invasion game - Football.
We will also continue with our weekly swimming lesson on Mondays

We will look at 'I am being more active' through our PACs Award.

In our **POL-ED lessons** we will be learning about **Relationships**.
