

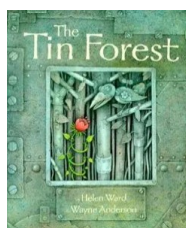

This term we will be covering the topic of '**States of matter**'

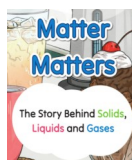
Children will learn:
