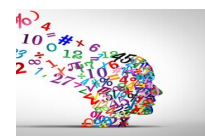
Welcome back! We hope you've all had an enjoyable break and are ready for the Summer term ahead. With brighter days and plenty to look forward to, we're excited to continue supporting pupils in their learning.

English

This term, pupils will be exploring a non-fiction unit based on the Titanic. They will develop their transactional writing skills through diary entries, letters and newspaper reports, learning how to adapt their writing for different purposes and audiences. Pupils will focus on using accurate punctuation, organising ideas into clear paragraphs and selecting appropriate vocabulary, while building confidence in planning, drafting and editing their work.

Maths

This term, pupils will be developing their understanding of geometry and shape, focusing on angles in shapes and key angle facts. They will learn how to calculate missing angles in triangles, quadrilaterals and around a point, as well as identify and describe different types of angles. We will build confidence in using clear methods, applying knowledge to problem-solving tasks and explaining reasoning.



Science

This half term in science, pupils will be learning about energy and power in everyday life. They will explore different types of energy, how energy is transferred, and how electrical devices work. Pupils will also look at the power of household appliances, practise simple calculations, and learn how energy use links to domestic fuel bills, helping them understand real-world applications of science.

PSHE

This term, pupils will explore a range of important topics to support their personal development and wellbeing. They will learn about online safety and social media, building positive friendships and understanding respectful relationships. Lessons will also cover positive masculinity, conflict resolution, self-esteem, hate crime awareness and puberty, helping pupils develop confidence, resilience and the skills needed to make safe and informed choices.



Personal Development Programme

This half term, pupils will continue to take part in our Personal Development programme, which supports their social, emotional and mental health needs while building important life and work-related skills. In each lesson, pupils will be encouraged to grow in confidence and self-awareness, show a positive attitude to learning, work well with others, and manage their own behaviour. The programme is designed to help pupils develop the personal skills they need to succeed both in school and beyond whilst having fun!

POL-ED

Pupils will be learning how to build positive and respectful relationships. They will explore the difference between banter and bullying, learn about child-on-child abuse in an age-appropriate way, and discuss healthy ways to deal with conflict and friendship breakdowns. Pupils will also consider why trust is important and develop their understanding of a wide range of emotions, helping them to recognise and manage their feelings.
