English

Maths

This term, pupils will be exploring a non-fiction unit based on the Titanic. They will develop their transactional writing skills through diary entries, letters and newspaper reports, learning how to adapt their writing for different purposes and audiences. Pupils will focus on using accurate punctuation, organising ideas into clear paragraphs and selecting appropriate vocabulary, while building confidence in planning,

This term, pupils will be developing their understanding of geometry and shape, focusing on angles in shapes and key angle facts. They will learn how to calculate missing angles in triangles, quadrilaterals and around a point, as well as identify and describe different types of angles. We will build confidence in using clear methods, applying knowledge to problem-solving tasks and explaining reasoning.



Science

PSHE

This term, pupils will be exploring evolution, learning how living things have changed over time. They will study the work of Charles Darwin and understand how characteristics are inherited and how adaptations help organisms survive in different environments. Lessons will include discussions, investigations and examples from the natural world to help pupils build confidence explaining how and why species evolve.



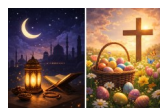
This term, pupils will explore a range of important topics to support their personal development and wellbeing. They will learn about online safety and social media, building positive friendships and understanding respectful relationships. Lessons will also cover positive masculinity, conflict resolution, self-esteem, hate crime awareness and puberty, helping pupils develop confidence, resilience and the skills needed to make safe and informed choices.



Personal Development Programme

POL-ED

This half term, pupils will continue developing practical life skills through gardening and creative projects. They will maintain and care for plants, learning how to support growth and keep outdoor spaces tidy. Alongside this, pupils will build confidence using sewing machines to create items such as pencil cases and cushions, developing independence, patience and pride in their work.



Pupils will be learning how to build positive and respectful relationships. They will explore the difference between banter and bullying, learn about child-on-child abuse in an age-appropriate way, and discuss healthy ways to deal with conflict and friendship breakdowns. Pupils will also consider why trust is important and develop their understanding of a wide range of emotions, helping them to recognise and manage their feelings.
