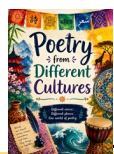

Welcome back! We hope you've had a great break and are ready for the final term and hopefully better weather!

English

In English, the children will be studying a range of poetry from different cultures, exploring how poets share experiences, traditions, values and perspectives from around the world. They will develop their skills in reading, analysing and interpreting poetry, learning how writers use language, structure and poetic devices to create meaning and engage readers. Throughout the unit, pupils will practise selecting and exploring evidence from texts, expressing their own informed opinions and using subject-specific vocabulary to discuss literary techniques. They will also develop their writing skills by communicating ideas clearly and effectively while gaining a greater appreciation of cultural diversity through literature.



Maths

In Maths this term, the children will be developing their understanding of speed, distance and time, including converting between hours and minutes and solving real-life problems using these concepts. They will also build confidence with decimal numbers through addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, including working with powers of 10. Later in the term, pupils will explore the properties of numbers, such as multiples, factors, prime numbers and square and cube numbers. They will also strengthen their knowledge of fractions by finding equivalent fractions, simplifying fractions, and adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers.



Science

In Science, the children will be learning about particles, materials and mixtures. They will explore atoms, elements and compounds, and investigate the difference between pure and impure substances. As part of this unit, they will learn about solutions and solubility, before carrying out practical investigations using a range of separation techniques, including filtration, crystallisation, evaporation, distillation and chromatography. The unit will culminate with pupils applying their knowledge to select and use appropriate separation methods for different materials and mixtures.



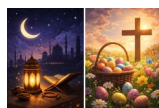
PSHE

In PSHE, the children will be learning about money management and making informed financial decisions. They will explore budgeting, savings, loans and interest, as well as different types of financial transactions and financial products. The children will also learn to distinguish between wants and needs, helping them understand the importance of making responsible choices. To conclude the unit, they will investigate ethical shopping and consider how their purchasing decisions can have an impact on people, communities and the

Throughout the unit, they will discuss how it can feel to witness a crime and consider the responsibilities we all have in creating safe and respectful communities.
