Welcome back! We hope you've had a great break and are ready for the final term and hopefully better weather!

English

This term, pupils will be exploring a non-fiction unit based on the Titanic. They will develop their transactional writing skills through diary entries, letters and newspaper reports, learning how to adapt their writing for different purposes and audiences. Pupils will focus on using accurate punctuation, organising ideas into clear paragraphs and selecting appropriate vocabulary, while building confidence in planning, drafting and editing their work.

Maths

In Maths this term, the children will develop their understanding of tables, probability, and presenting data using graphs and charts. They will learn how to organise, interpret and analyse data, as well as describe the likelihood of events. Pupils will apply these skills to real-life contexts to build confidence in using maths in everyday situations.



Science

In Science, the children will be learning about light and how it behaves. They will explore how light travels, how we see objects, and how light reflects and refracts. Pupils will investigate mirrors, different materials, and how shadows are formed. The unit will end with students applying their understanding to explain everyday uses of light, such as mirrors and lenses.



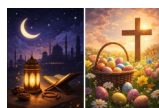
PSHE

In PSHE, the children will be learning about money management and making informed financial decisions. They will explore budgeting, savings, loans and interest, as well as different types of financial transactions and financial products. The children will also learn to distinguish between wants and needs, helping them understand the importance of making responsible choices. To conclude the unit, they will investigate ethical shopping and consider how their purchasing decisions can have an impact on people, communities and the environment.



Personal Development Programme

Next term, pupils will continue to take part in our Personal Development programme. This term, the children will be learning about the FIFA World Cup and exploring a range of exciting related topics, including different countries, cultures, geography, teamwork, and sporting values. Alongside this, they will continue to enjoy regular Forest School sessions, where they will develop their outdoor learning skills, build confidence, and take part in hands-on activities in a natural environment.



POL-ED

In PSHE, the children will be developing their understanding of the law, equality and respect. They will learn about the age of criminal responsibility, protected characteristics and the impact of hate crime. The children will also explore important topics such as racism and homophobia, helping them to understand the importance of inclusion, fairness and celebrating diversity. Throughout the unit, they will discuss how it can feel to witness a crime and consider the responsibilities we all have in creating safe and respectful communities.
