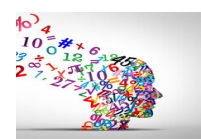
7 weeks left to Summer holidays, and we've got lots of learning packed in! Hopefully, we can take advantage of some outside learning if the weather allows!

### English

In English, pupils will complete their Titanic non-fiction unit by editing, improving and publishing information leaflets before moving on to letter writing from a character's perspective. Later in the term, we will begin exploring poetry using selected poems from I Am the Seed That Grew the Tree, focusing on imagery, language, personal responses and writing our own poems.

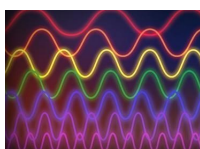
### Maths

This term, pupils will focus on developing confidence and fluency with the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will revisit key number skills, including factors, multiples, times tables and mental calculation strategies. Pupils will apply their learning through practical activities and problem-solving tasks, helping them build the strong mathematical foundations needed for future learning across all areas of maths.



### Science

This term, pupils will be exploring light and how it travels. They will investigate light sources, reflection, shadows and how we see objects. Through a range of practical investigations, pupils will develop their scientific enquiry skills by making predictions, carrying out tests and drawing conclusions. The unit will encourage curiosity and help pupils understand how light behaves in the world around them.



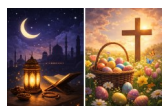
### PSHE / Pol-Ed

This half term, pupils will explore important aspects of living in the wider world, developing their understanding of money and financial decision-making. They will learn about budgeting, saving, borrowing, loans, interest rates and different financial products, helping them understand how money is managed in everyday life. Pupils will also consider the difference between wants and needs, make informed choices as consumers and explore the importance of ethical shopping.



### Personal Development Programme

Personal Development will have a football focus this half term, linked to the FIFA World Cup. Pupils will learn about the tournament, football cultures around the world, famous players, sports journalism and match-day mathematics. They will also take part in creative design activities and continue developing responsibility, teamwork and independence through our gardening project and outdoor learning opportunities.



Alongside this, pupils will develop their understanding of laws, rights and responsibilities within society. Topics will include the age of criminal responsibility, protected characteristics, hate crime, racism and homophobia. Through discussion and real-life scenarios, pupils will learn how to recognise discrimination, challenge prejudice appropriately and respond safely if they witness crime or unfair treatment. These lessons aim to build confidence, respect and responsible citizenship.
